Ambulance and steriliser for Lakhnadon Christian Hospital in India

Funds are desperately needed to replace essential resources at the Lakhnadon Christian Hospital in India.

A new **ambulance** is required for transporting seriously ill patients from surrounding villages, often over very rough ground. It is needed for driving patients up to 120 miles to the main cities in the area, from where medical supplies can also be collected. The new ambulance will replace the current aged and worn-out vehicle, providing the community with dependable access to medical treatment.

A new high pressure steam **steriliser** is also needed to sterilise instruments for operations. The present steriliser requires frequent repair and uses a lot of electricity. Without a reliable steriliser it is not possible for the hospital to continue providing vital surgical services.



Toilet and shower facilities for camps in Romania

Toilet and shower facilities are needed as soon as possible for two campsites in Romania used by the organisation 'Eastern Europe for Christ'.

Every year Christians from the UK partner with believers in countries such as Romania, Hungary and the Ukraine to run holiday camps for deprived children and young people. As well as providing a lot of fun, the camps give the campers opportunities for learning English, participating in sports activities and hearing about the Good News of Jesus.

Two campsites in Romania boast only very basic facilities for washing. Toilets and showers are required to ensure the good health of campers in this crucial ministry among Romanian children and youth.

Clean drinking water for a Peruvian village

A village by the name of Nueva Jerusalem in northern Peru is the focus for a community health project run by the San Lucas organisation. Funds are needed to provide **clean drinking water** for the 32 families living in the village. This will involve constructing reservoir catchments and installing pipes into each home.

The local church is planning to be actively involved in helping with this project which will also include training in good hygiene and the prevention



of infectious diseases. The project is part of a wider initiative by the San Lucas organisation involving awareness - raising of environmental issues.

Jerusalem will make a big difference to the lives and health of the villagers as well as give local Christians the opportunity to serve their community in a practical way.
